

# Why is the Antichrist from Egypt?



*“Therefore the he goat waxed very great: and when he was strong, the great horn was broken; and for it came up four notable ones toward the four winds of heaven. And out of one of them came forth a little horn (this refers to the Antichrist), which waxed exceeding great, toward the south, and toward the east, and toward the pleasant land” (Daniel 8:8,9)*

The explanation is found later on in the same chapter verse 21 onward, *“the goat is Greece, and the great horn . . . is the first king”*. (Daniel 8:21)

Alexander the Great was the first great king of Greece. *“the great horn was broken; and for it came up four notable ones toward the four winds of heaven”*. (Daniel 8:8)

When Alexander died at early age, his kingdom was divided between his four generals: first the Ptolemaic Kingdom of **Egypt**, second the **Seleucid** Empire in the east, third the Kingdom of Pergamon in Asia Minor which is present day **Turkey**, and fourth Macedon present day **Greece**.

This prophecy was given over 200 years before Alexander the Great. *“And out of one of them came forth a little horn, which waxed exceeding great, toward the south, and toward the east, and toward the pleasant land”*, which is Israel.

This little horn refers to the Antichrist, as it explains in the same chapter verse 28 that, *“In the latter time . . . a king of fierce countenance and **understanding dark sentences** shall stand up.”* (Daniel 8:9,23)

The Antichrist comes out of one of these four mentioned kingdoms. **By the process of elimination we end up with Egypt, as the three other parts of Alexander’s divided kingdom either double up in direction or there is a sea south of them.**

The Antichrist has his roots in Egypt. Isn’t that **another copy of Jesus**. *“Out of Egypt have I called my son.”* (Matthew 2:15; Hosea 11:1)
